Confirmation of Participation

All parts of the RBPC are required for competing startups.

Thursday's events are at **The Ion**. Friday's and Saturday's events are at **McNair Hall in the Jones School** of Business at Rice University. Saturday night's Awards Ceremony is at the **Hilton Americas Hotel** in downtown Houston.

What to Expect at the RBPC

- Check the RBPC website under "2025 Competition" -> Competitor Resources for most up-todate info (general info, schedules, What to Expect, Scoring Criteria, hotel booking link, etc.)
- 300+ judges throughout the 3 days of competition
- 30+ prizes with total value of over \$1 million
- All competing startups get a minimum of \$900 prize
- Startups are judged on investment potential—where an investor/funder would put their money
- All meals provided; transportation between the conference hotel and campus is provided (but getting to and from the awards banquet is not)
- Startups are responsible for airfare, hotel, airport transfers, incidentals
- The RBPC is a big deal--bring your A-Game! Bring your energy (you will need it)!

The Next 4 Weeks – How to Prepare

- Explore **EFN Mentoring program** 4 weeks of free mentoring
- Practice your pitches check the RBPC website for **past competition videos** from the EPC and Finals
- Prep your "deliverables" (full list is under Competitor Resources -> What to bring to the RBPC):
 - 10-minute verbal investor pitch (you will use it at least twice)
 - Pitch deck for 10-min pitch (be tech-enabled, esp. Apple products)
 - 60-second verbal elevator pitch (no deck or slides needed)
 - Showcase table items
- Read the Competition Rules and Format and What to Expect docs
- Read the Prizes page of the website before coming to the RBPC
- Read the Stipulations for Prizes and Guidelines for Accepting Prizes

The Next 4 Weeks – How to Prepare

Check the list of questions judges frequently ask (What to Expect doc):

- they love to ask about IP or unique selling prop
- they want to know what funding you are seeking (don't say you aren't raising funds)
- Check the list of "Advice from RBPC Judges" new this year! Coming soon

Judges want to see:

- Clear and defined product or service
- Proprietary tech or unique selling prop
- What you need to advance your startup
- Why you need funding to advance your startup/clarity on fundraising strategy & goals
- If you are coachable

The Next 4 Weeks – Confirm Reservations

Book hotel by March 26 (you are not required to stay there, but a shuttle to and from competition sites will be available) – see website Competitor Resources

Confirm guest list – who will come from your team?

- At least 2, and up to 4, presenting team members
- Up to 2 academic advisors (academic or other advisor)
- More team members than that, and there is a charge to attend, if we can accommodate them
- The RBPC is a **closed** event; there is no walk-up registration; there are no extra guests last-minute; anyone that turns up will be sent home
- The Awards Banquet is also a closed event (there are 700+ people in attendance!)
- Put all info in Part 2.2 of the application

Let everyone know you are coming to the RBPC!
